By the time we were finished with lunch and a short Business meeting, the cold wind and overcast had turned to blue sky with white puffy clouds! It turned out to be a beautiful day by the end of our time there!

Frank Squire was waiting there when we arrived at noon. We wanted to get there an hour early so Erik Stewart could get hot dogs on the grill! Our next Tour opportunity will be our Capay Valley Spring Fling Tour out of the home of Joe and Dorene Gomes in Woodland. We will gather at their home on Saturday, May 3rd and tour together on both May 3rd and May 4th. A sign-up sheet along with information on the Tour, cost, etc., was handed out at the Picnic and I have included that sheet as an attachment to this newsletter. The cost for all meals is \$80 for the weekend (including light breakfasts, lunch, and our Saturday night camaraderie dinner) for adults and \$20 for children! Dorene needs your response and checks for this Tour as soon as possible so she can get a “head-count” as well as have the funds for meals. Our Saturday evening camaraderie dinner will be catered at their home with a menu including Tri-Tip or Chicken Marsala! Joe and Dorene have enough space to store everyone’s tow vehicles, trailers, and DB’s, so you don’t have to worry about that detail. Additionally, they have graciously made available for sale to all participants, at their cost, gasoline and diesel fuel which they have on the property. Saturday’s itinerary will center around the Capay Valley. We will be having picnic lunch at Capay Valley Lavender Farm on Saturday. The owner will have tables in the shade for us, give an intro, a demo, and anyone who wants to walk with him on a tour can do that, too. They have a store, restrooms and lavender ice cream for sale!

Sunday’s itinerary will include the Town of Winters, as well as a visit to the Monticello Dam/Lake Berryessa area. We will return to Gomes’ for lunch and dessert.

On the attached flyer, you will see the names and contact information for three hotels in Woodland. You must call to make your own reservations and they are not offering our group any special discount, but will honor a AAA discount so be sure to ask for it. Also, they have been alerted to our need for ground floor rooms and have said that they will try their best to provide them. Plan on getting to the hotel of your choice in your tow vehicle on Saturday evening; no one will have to

worry about their DB since it will be parked at Gomes' for the night. (There is no protected parking for DB's at any of the three hotels.) You can arrive at Gomes' home (see flyer for address) Friday anytime after noon, and unload your DB.

Please reserve May 3rd and May 4th on your calendar and get your check to Dorene as soon as possible. Then, call your choice of hotel to make sure you get a room; May 3rd is not that far away!!!

At the Picnic, Karl Skow told us about the second Monterey "Rain or Shine" Tour. Everyone had such a good time on this Tour last year Karl and Elvia have set it up again for us. I have attached the preliminary information about the Tour that Karl distributed at the Picnic. Please see the information presented in it and act accordingly. Once again, we will be staying at the Sunset Inn in Pacific Grove, and they have reserved all 17 of their rooms for us. They will hold them for us, at the special rate they have once again offered us, until August 10th. So that they can plan, and Karl and Elvia can plan, please reserve your room as soon as possible. Sunset Inn will refund your money if you cancel before 60 days before October 11th. If you cancel within 60 or less days before October 11th, you will most probably be charged for one (not two) night's stay.

Also, note that if you want to come to the area and stay overnight before the Tour (so you can easily make the Driver's and Navigator's Meeting on Friday, October 10th; remember that this is a three day Tour, and it starts on Friday), there are an assortment of hotels that Karl has talked to about our group and several of us stayed at those last year the night before the Tour.

Karl and Elvia said that details about an itinerary, etc. will follow. But if you talk with anybody who went on this Tour last year, you will hear about how much fun it was. So, make those reservations and let Karl and Elvia know of your participation as soon as possible!
